The Pre-Conference Assembly is on Saturday, March 27, 2021. It will take place online. The room will open at 8am. The event begins promptly at 8:30am. The event will likely run until approximately 2pm.

Agenda Committee: –Since last month's report, additional meetings of the General Service Conference Agenda Committee have taken place (online). These advance Committee meetings are primarily preparatory in nature, combined with a "meet and greet" feature, to allow the Committee to hit the ground running during the Conference week. This year the Agenda Committee has 10 agenda items (4 of which were carried over from last year's General Service Conference).

A.A.W.S./G.S.O. Updates

Corrections— The Winter "Sharing from Behind the Walls" was distributed to A.A. members in many facilities throughout the U.S. and Canada. In 2020, 560 male A.A. members inside correctional facilities were linked with A.A. members on the outside through the Corrections Correspondence Service. 105 female A.A. members inside correctional facilities were linked in the same period.

Group Services—As the new coordinator continues working with the Fellowship Connection team, the topic of online groups repeatedly arises. The assignment seeks local shared experience, including feedback from the Online Intergroup of Alcoholics Anonymous. Moreover, the topic of online groups is one of the many agenda items for this year's General Service Conference.

International—The final report is available

for the 26th World Service Meeting, which took place online in December of 2020. The Final Report can be accessed <u>here</u>. The 27th World Service Meeting in 2022 will have the theme: "Carrying the Message of A.A. in the Digital Age."

Regional Forums—A pancontinental virtual Forum for remote communities in Argentina and Canada is being planned, which will probably take place in May of 2021. Please note that the Northeast Regional Forum (the forum for our region) is scheduled for June 4th-6th, 2021.

Finance—The revenue split between literature sales and contributions in 2020 was about 37% literature/63% contributions whereas it is historically 58% literature/42% contributions. The AAWS Board approved a recommended budget for 2021 reflecting \$15,594,000 in revenue and \$14,952,613 in expenses.

Publishing—Several draft updates to pamphlets are underway. The Big Book is now available in 73 languages, having added Tatar (Russia) and Oriya (India). Also, A.A.W.S. has enhanced its distribution of ebooks and audiobooks for distribution through 38 major ebook platforms and 13 major audiobook

Technology/Communication/Services (TCS)—113 videos have been posted to the A.A.W.S. YouTube channel. A Regional Forums video was posted to aa.org and YouTube.
