#### General Service Board Chair Search Update

The search for a new Chair of the General Service Board (GSB) is ongoing. As many of you are aware, the Trustees' Nominating Committee was unable to identify their recommendation for General Service Board prior to the General Service Conference. In an effort to ensure that they were using prudence and not rushing the procedure, a decision was made to put forward a slate with the Chair position left blank. The first vice-chair will serve as the Interim Chair until a new chair can be selected and approved by the 74th General Service Conference.

To date, the Trustees' Nominating Committee has received 10 resumes and is in the process of reviewing those. These will be narrowed down to a short list of candidates and invitations for interviews will be sent out to those selected. Interviews will be conducted the week of July 17-21, which will allow for thorough discussion by the Trustees' Nominating Committee at the Board weekend scheduled at the end of the month. At that time, 2-3 candidates will be identified to interview with the full General Service Board. Those candidates will be notified in the month of August and the GSB interviews will be scheduled to occur during the October Board weekend.

Once this process is complete, the candidate that will be recommended for election to General Service Board Chair will be identified. The slate of GSB Officers to be presented to the General Service Conference will be finalized by the Trustees Nominating Committee at the January Board

The hope is that this slow, deliberate process will allow for the selection of the best possible candidate and also for unity among the GSB, the Conference and the Fellowship as a whole.
