Alternate Delegate's Corner

As we speed through another Connecticut summer, I am pleased to share that things have been the best kind of busy in Area 11 on all fronts. I have had the pleasure of attending numerous events and service days that bring about a great balance of unity, service, and recovery. Most recently, the

Rompiendo Fronteras/Breaking Frontiers event drew a full house of attendees from across the state and across three fellowships. As you may know, Alcoholics Anonymous has a special relationship with Al-Anon Family Groups and their Alateen program. This cooperation – without affiliation – was in full swing during that event, with speakers, workshops and programming (and great food) that appealed to attendees whether they seek their own personal recovery, family recovery, or both.

Recently, I had the privilege of connecting with a past trustee of the General Service Board. He was gracious with his time in sharing some of his own personal experiences on the road to delegate and, ultimately, through his time as trustee. He offered insights on fostering more effective communication and embracing the varying degrees of conflict and debate in A.A. business settings, among other items. I was left with a truly positive feeling about the direction of the fellowship. He reminded me of the spiritual substance of sacrifice, sharing that there was a survey of Trustees, Directors, Past Trustees and Emeriti several years back post rotation to this end. Survey questions addressed the personal sacrifices of those in service at that level for which many respondents acknowledged, yes, there are sacrifices. The survey ended with the question, "Would you do it again, knowing what you know now?" and the response was a nearly unanimous YES.

I'll close by reminding you that Area 11 will be sponsoring a <u>bus trip</u> to our General Service Office on September 22nd at a cost of \$55. This will be my first visit to GSO so I am very much so eager to attend. There are 40 total seats being filled, and more than half are presently spoken for. If you are interested in attending, know that we will be attending an open A.A. meeting, followed by a tour of the General Service Office. As the efforts of these office workers represents a great part of our spiritual "basket money" contributed to the General Service Board in accordance with our 8th Tradition, this is a fantastic opportunity to see what A.A. is doing for you and for the next alcoholic we'll reach together.

Report and Charter: As the Chair of the Conference Committee on Report and Charter, I met with the Chair of the Trustees Committee on the Conference prior to Board weekend to review items of interest to our committee. I will be meeting with her to follow up after Board weekend and then the Committee will meet to discuss the items in progress.

Quarterly Contribution Statement

Update: CFO Paul Konigstein released a statement on July 27 regarding the process of sending Quarterly Contribution Statements to DCMs. The process was re-established in the first quarter of 2023 but technical issues were encountered. They are currently working on solutions to these issues. Please be assured that group and individual contributions are being captured appropriately; it is only the reporting that has encountered issues and has resulted in the statements being incorrect. For this reason, they were not sent out.

While they are working on a solution for the reporting issues, Member Services and the Group Services desk are also collaborating on a project to improve the integrity of the group and district information in our systems. The goal is that these combined efforts will result in the most accurate reporting possible.
