<u>International Convention</u> <u>Updates</u>

The International Convention will be held in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada from July 3-6, 2025. Registration for the event opened on September 10, 2024, and the response was overwhelming! 13,154 registrations were processed on the first day alone, which is amazing! It is unsurprising that so many members are eager to gather together again, as this will be our first inperson International Convention since 2015 in Atlanta.

Despite all the preparation that has been done by the staff and consultants working on this event, there were still some challenges given the large volume of members trying to register and book housing simultaneously, and the process was not without difficulties. Many members experienced long wait times, getting booted out of the system, and long delays in receiving confirmation emails, among other frustrations. Some changes have been made to the system, and Patrick C., the 2025 International Convention Coordinator at GSO, has provided an update, which you can read in full by clicking here.

If you plan on attending the IC and have not yet registered or booked housing, do not panic! It is not too late! You can find all the information on the process by visiting aa.org or clicking here. If you were able to register but were not able to book housing, there are several suggestions for how to secure a place to stay:

- You can check availability regularly and book hotel rooms through your registration record online if any rooms become available.
- There are currently alternative housing options still available, such as dorm rooms or Airbnb. These can also be

- accessed through your registration record online.
- You can secure housing on your own directly through hotels or third-party vendors. This would be completely independent of any negotiated rates or contracts involving the International Convention.

Fall Assembly: Save the Date!

This is a voting assembly, and the Area Officers (Delegate, Alternate Delegate, Area Chair, Area Treasurer, Alternate Treasurer, Area Recording Secretary, Area Registrar) to serve for Panel 75 (2025-2026) will be selected. Area 11's nominee for Trustee-At-Large US will also be elected during this assembly. All voting members of the Area Assembly should attend; observers and visitors are welcome to attend. Individual/Group Contribution Reporting Issue update: An enhancement has been made to the records and accounting system at GSO, and as of July 1, 2024, Seventh Tradition group contributions made online from a member's account are now being correctly recorded as "group" contributions. The next step in the process is redesigning the quarterly Contributions Statements. This work is underway, and another update will be provided later this year. The process of developing the Fifth Edition of the book Alcoholics Anonymous is ongoing. There is no release date currently, and the earliest it could be brought to the General Service Conference for approval would be in April 2025 if the manuscript has been completed by then. Updates will be provided as the work on this project continues.

The creation of the draft of the Fourth Edition Alcohólicos Anónimos is being guided by an Appointed Committee Member (ACM) of the trustees' Literature Committee and a working group of Hispanic A.A. members. Updated chapter translations are being provided by the Language Services department on a bi-monthly basis. The intent of the review of the existing translation is not to change the wording in the first 168 pages but to ensure that the translation accurately reflects the content from the source language (English). The working group is also continuing the selection process for personal stories.
